

# 2019 Troop 50 Ski Trip – Jack Frost/Big Boulder



**Event:** Ski Trip to Jack Frost & Big Boulder in Blakeslee, PA

**Food Plans:** Adults will provide food as part of the trip fee (Fri night, Sat morning & evening, Sun morning). Scouts will be responsible for purchasing lunch at the ski slope on Saturday (expect to pay \$10 - \$15). Alternately, lunch can be provided to the adult leaders on Friday at Ebenezer and kept cool until lunchtime on Saturday.

**Cost:** The costs for this trip will be in 2 parts. Part 1 is food and lodging. Part 2 is skiing/snow tubing. Part 1 fee will include adult-provided meals/snacks for Friday evening, Saturday breakfast, Saturday dinner, Saturday evening, and Sunday morning. Part 1 fee will also include lodging in a heated cabin very near the slopes. Part 2 fee will vary depending on the skiing/snowboarding/snow tubing/lesson/rental plans of the scout. The fees for skiing/snowboarding/snow tubing/lessons/rentals are attached to this permission slip.

**Gear Req'd:**

- Class A uniform for travel home on Sunday.
- Pillow, sleeping bag and pad – We will be sleeping on the floor of the cabin.
- Mess kit and water bottle
- If you own your own skiing equipment, feel free to bring it. Otherwise, equipment can be rented at the slopes. All youth MUST wear helmets to ski or snowboard, and helmets can be rented. Helmets are not required to snow tube but are recommended.
- Skiing/Snowboarding attire includes water resistant gloves, coat, and snow pants that keep you warm. Warm wicking socks are required (Cotton is Rotten). Other possibilities include hand and toe warmers, face masks, ski goggles, and sunglasses. VERY thin skull caps can be worn underneath the helmet (not required), but normal cold weather hats do not fit under helmets. In general, the helmet will take the place of a warm hat.
- If you intend to sleep outside, appropriate outdoor gear will be required and checked by an adult leader prior to departure. If you need help with cold weather gear, refer to the winter packing checklist on the troop website.

**Location:** The cabin is located at Camp Mosey Wood (1 Character Rd., White Haven, PA 18661). Saturday morning, we be at Jack Frost Mountain (434 Jack Frost Mountain Rd, White Haven, PA 18661) from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. We will then return to the cabin for dinner. Following dinner, there will be a caravan for anyone interested to ski Big Boulder Mountain (357 Big Boulder Dr. Lake Harmony, PA 18624). The two ski resorts are about a 15 minute drive from one to the other and Camp Mosey Wood is in the middle of the two. All lift tickets are valid at both mountains for the entire day and night.
